These positions are being sought in support of new degree programs offering the Master of City and Regional Planning and the Master of Sustainable Design.

TENURE-TRACK POSITIONS

City and Regional Planning

The successful candidate should have background and experience in urban and regional planning, in addition to academic credentials, and demonstrate experience or potential in teaching. Prior experience or potential for an urban-oriented research agenda, publications, grants and advising are important considerations. The successful candidate will demonstrate expertise in planning methods and applications, as well as quantitative methods and Geographic Information Systems (GIS). Candidates are expected to hold a Ph.D. (advanced ABD considered) in an urban or planning-related field, although those with a professional master's degree and significant planning experience will be considered. Primary duties will include teaching introductory and advanced courses in core areas of study in the newly established Master of City and Regional Planning program. This will include courses in GIS, planning and quantitative methods, and urban economics with an opportunity to teach some courses in his/her area of expertise.

Sustainable Design – Systems & Simulation

The successful candidate will have significant expertise in the integration of building design and sustainable environmental control technologies at an advanced level through the use of simulation models as well as traditional methods. The ideal candidate will balance theory and practice, exhibiting skills in both lecturing and studio critique. A related research agenda, publications and grants are important considerations. The successful candidate will demonstrate experience or potential in teaching and will possess a terminal or professional degree in architecture or engineering and fluency in software applications related to the area of expertise. Added consideration may be given for additional credentials beyond the professional degree (e.g., LEED AP or Ph.D.). Primary duties will include teaching at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. Graduate level teaching will include systems and simulation courses in the newly established Master of Sustainable Design program.

ADDITIONAL DUTIES: Both positions may involve participation in design studios, lectures, advanced seminars, the supervision of thesis students and student advising. Full-time faculty members also contribute through research and service. Research may be creative, professional or theoretical. External grants, commissions, competitions, committee duties and service to the community, university and the school are important.
