**Assistant Professor of Urban and Regional Planning  
(Tenure-track Position)**

The Department of Planning and Urban Studies at the University of New Orleans seeks applications for a tenure track position in land use and environmental planning at the Assistant Professor level effective August 2008. We are a dynamic, young faculty looking for an energetic person who wants to participate in the recovery of a truly unique city. Applicants with an interest in one or more of the following are encouraged to apply: urban revitalization, urban land markets, brownfield redevelopment, environmental justice, mitigation planning and planning along the urban-coastal fringe. Qualified candidates must hold a Ph.D. in urban planning or a related field, or complete the Ph.D. by August 2008. Candidates must also demonstrate a strong commitment to and interest in research, graduate education and professional planning practice.

The candidate for this position will teach graduate courses in land use planning, environmental planning and GIS and will be expected to supervise masters and doctoral level students. AICP certification or intent to seek certification is preferred. We will begin to review applications on January 15<sup>th</sup> and will continue until the position is filled.

The University of New Orleans, a member of the Louisiana State University system, has a post-Katrina enrollment of over 11,000 students and offers a broad range of academic programs, nearly one-quarter of which are at the master's or doctoral level. UNO is an SREB Four-Year 2 institution, a Carnegie Doctoral/Research University-Intensive, and a COC/SACS Level VI institution. The Department of Planning and Urban Studies offers three graduate degrees: the Master of Urban and Regional Planning (MURP); the Master of Science in Urban Studies; and the Ph.D. in Urban Studies as well as a B.S. in Urban Studies and Planning. The department's MURP program is currently the only accredited professional planning program within the three states of Louisiana, Mississippi, and Arkansas. Department faculty and students have been actively engaged in post-Katrina rebuilding efforts.
